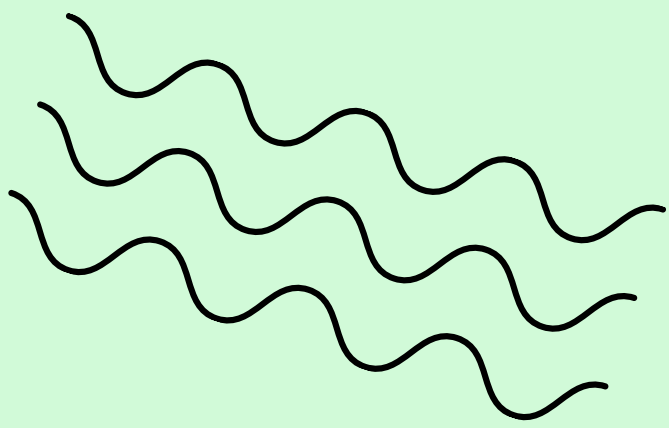
✨ **Did You Know? (Fun Facts)**

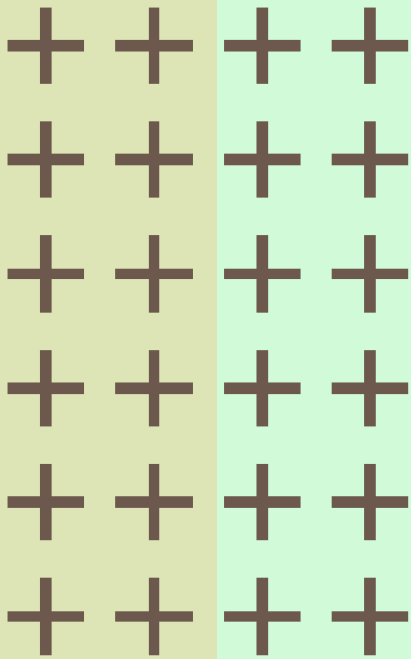
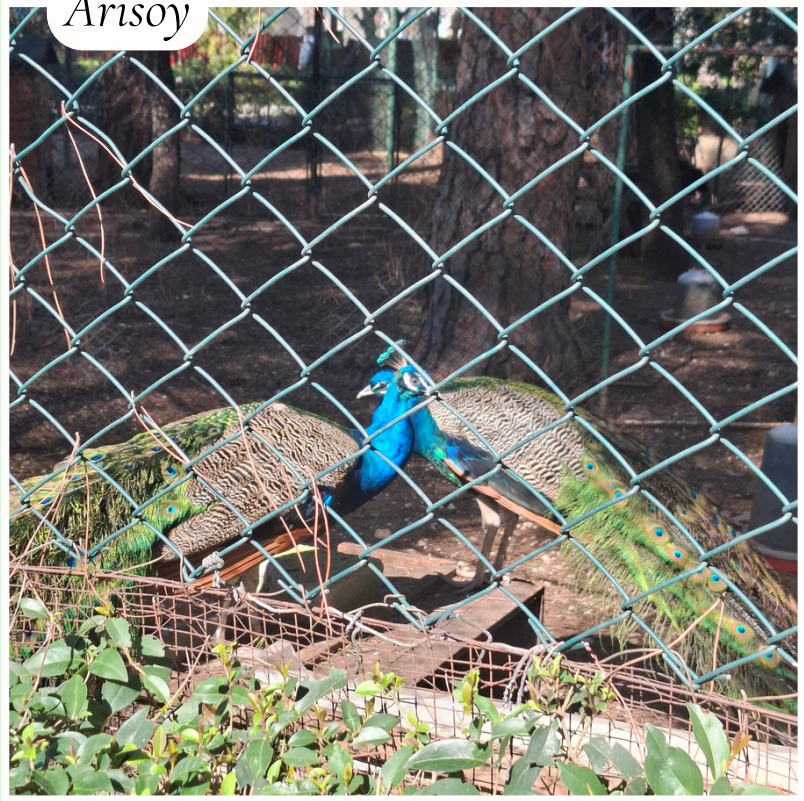
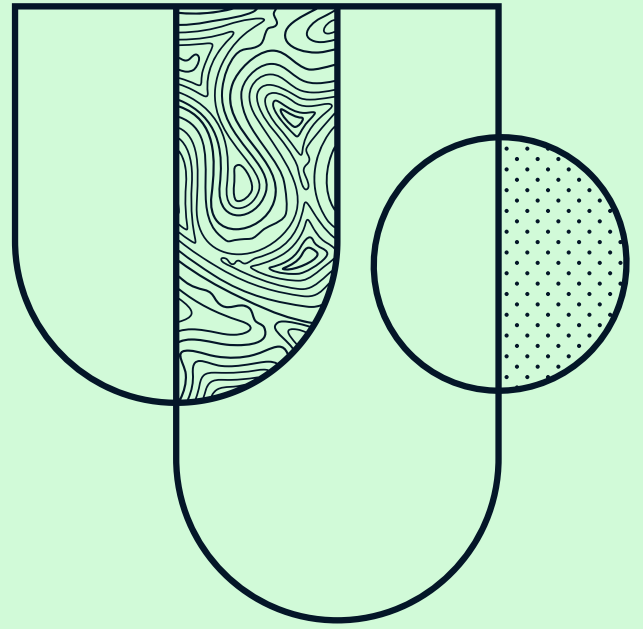

Yellow: joy, optimism and friendship

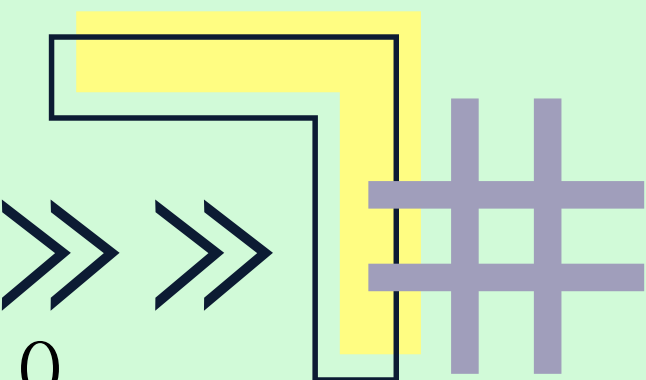
Pink: gentleness, love and romance

ABSTRACT

This study aims to gauge factors affecting students' eagerness to speak English in the classroom. A quantitative study was conducted with 50 ELT freshmen. Findings revealed that motivation was the strongest factor, while speaking anxiety was moderate. Although highly motivated, students' concerns held them back, and their self-perceived competence did not match their willingness to communicate. A supportive, anxiety-free environment is essential for confident speaking.

INTRODUCTION

Speaking is a pivotal skill in English Language Teaching, functioning as a primary tool for both careers and daily life. During their professional development, teacher candidates may feel anxious about speaking in public despite having strong motivation. Fear of peer humiliation can negatively affect their drive, hindering the effective use of the target language. This study examines the factors affecting students' eagerness to speak English in classroom settings and explores potential gender differences.

METHODOLOGY

A quantitative research design was adopted, recruiting 50 first-year university students on a voluntary basis. Data was collected via a 32-item, five-point Likert scale questionnaire. The survey measured four main constructs: willingness to speak, speaking anxiety, self-perceived competence, and motivation.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Most participants were female (68%), and 54% considered themselves at an Upper-Intermediate level. About 92% reported participating in classroom communication 'often' or 'sometimes'.

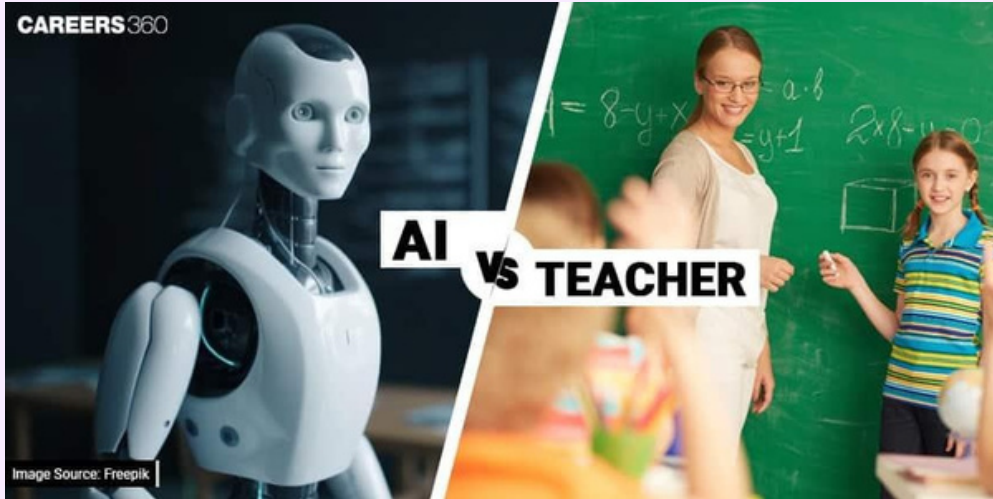
- **Motivation:** Emerged as the strongest factor ($M=4.46$). Students view English as a professional prerequisite rather than a hobby, which enhances their drive to communicate efficiently.
- **Willingness to Speak:** Also high ($M=3.77$), showing strong enthusiasm to join speaking activities when given the chance.
- **Self-Perceived Competence:** With a mean score of 3.63, students showed a realistic view of their skills, recognizing a need for continuous improvement.
- **Speaking Anxiety:** Ranked lowest ($M=2.02$), though students still harbor moderate concerns centered around making mistakes and facing peer judgment.

CONCLUSION

Pre-service English teachers are highly motivated to use the target language, but their self-perceived competence and fear of peer criticism occasionally hinder their readiness. Teachers hold a great responsibility to create a warm, proficiency-enhancing climate. When students feel secure and safe from immediate, judgmental correction by peers or instructors, they become naturally prepared to use the target language efficiently and confidently.

These "Aha!" moments—where curiosity meets discovery—are sparked by human passion. A robot can be efficient, but only a human can be inspiring.

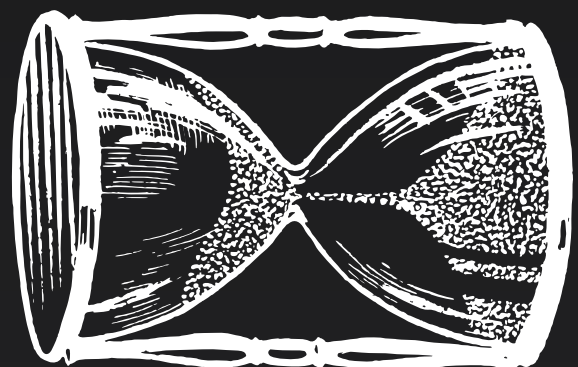
